ABOUT US



The Salvation Army is an international charitable Christian movement that operates in 132 countries around the world. Its mission is to spread the good news of the Gospel and support the community without discriminatory approaches.

The Salvation Army has been operating in Georgia since 1993, implementing many charitable projects and sharing the good news with society. It has eight local Salvation Army corps in four cities and one headquarter.

PROJECTS/PROGRAMS



During 2022, several dozens of projects were implemented, including community support, first aid for IDPs from Ukraine, and domestic improvement projects.



Due to the ongoing war in Ukraine, many IDPs have entered Georgia in the last year. According to the mission of the Salvation Army, the largest part of the target audience for support was internally displaced persons from Ukraine, especially children and people with disabilities.

SUPPORT SOCIETY

- The laundry project in the Ponichal corps serves lowincome families with many children and other vulnerable groups.
- Within the framework of "the Newman feeding" fund, food baskets were distributed to families with many children, the elderly and other vulnerable families.



- 3 Social Day Centers for the elderly where beneficiaries dine, celebrate holidays and have programs based on their age and interests.
- Children's day care centers child safety standards are provided for children. The centers consist of educational, cognitive circles and sports activities of various contents. Includes one full meal.





- In Lagodekhi corps, the children's playground was organized with high-quality slides and swings. A small sports basketball court was also repaired.
- Summer camps were held in July-August, for a total of 200 beneficiaries, children and young people from 6 to 20 years of age participated.

IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS



- Within the framework of the project, the Batumi Corps purchased a new mini car, which will serve the projects aimed at local and Ukrainian IDPs.
- In Rustavi Corps, the inside and outside areas of the corps building were repaired, and a safe and comfortable environment was created for the beneficiaries to implement the projects.





- Day centres were organized for Ukrainian children in Batumi and Tbilisi corps buildings. With fun, cognitive and therapeutic programs.
- Helping IDPs with canteens, hygiene items and food baskets. Families received food for 8 months according to the number of family members.

HELP TO UKRAINIAN REFUGEES



- A summer rehabilitation camp for children and adults from 6 to 16 years of age was held in Ureki for twenty days. Exercise, thermal treatment and psychological counselling were available to all participants. Medical assistance was provided to all beneficiaries in need.
- 4 200 GEL vouchers for clothes and shoes were distributed to 500 children displaced from Ukraine.




